Morningside State School swimming program operates during Terms 1 and 4. Each class will swim once a week. The PE Teacher and a qualified swim instructor are present for all lessons. As swimming is a normal part of the school curriculum it is expected that all students will attend. In the event of illness, where a student cannot swim, please provide a short note to the class teacher.

N.B. Children with colds, ear infections or open wounds will not be allowed to attend swimming activities.

Students in Years 3 to 6 also swim as part of their Friday afternoon Intra-school sports rotations in Terms 1 and 4. Students may also have the opportunity to swim as part of our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) reward system in Terms 1 and 4.

All students will attend the pool whether they are swimming or not. Please complete the permission form below and return it to your class teacher.

The following items are required for swimming:

- Sun shirt – new Education Queensland regulations require all students to wear a sun shirt. **No shirt means a no swim policy will apply.**
- One piece swimming togs
- Swimming cap
- Towel
- Sunscreen
